 - Online options like Survey Monkey may be cheaper but may not be easily accessible to all residents

Overview of Survey Responses


- An encouraging willingness to contribute to fund raising:

- Some confusion highlighted regarding sources of funding and roles / responsibilities of different governmental and nongovernmental agencies






Summary of Demographics

- Over half of respondents > 55 years of age this may not reflect entire population however, just respondents
- Most respondents are long-time residents this may reflect low turnover, and high retention for family ties and other reasons
- About ¼ have school-age kids at home if some have more than one child, then it may represent a large demographic approaching that of retirees?
- Most respondents have visited the Park in the last year, although for most it was likely only a single visit
- About 10% of respondents are current / former military but many families likely have current / former military members who were not respondents












Question did not identify if family members are in the military









- Some respondents suggest military and rail history can cohabit, while others are against this

Some Narrative Highlights

Narrative: Positives and Negatives

- Most common topic in the narrative responses was the caboose
 - Majority of comments regarding the caboose were positive (18 vs 7)
- Second most common topic was the bandstand
 - Comments split. Most respondents said some sort of bandstand should be present but there was a balance between attempting to preserve the existing bandstand (10:11), recognizing it is damaged, vs adding a new pavilion (7:3)
- Although the third most common topic addressed, responses regarding the monuments were overwhelmingly in favor of keeping

them in their current location (7:2)

- Great space to show spirit of the town.
- Have activities that co-inside with military happening and contests for the children. Try to include different ages of children for levels of concern.
- I assume this is the park by the school and library. It is a lovely park and a definite asset to the community. My grandchildren enjoy the play ground very impressive, especially for a small community. We enjoy visiting the park and a caboose would be a definite plus. Thank you.
- I attended a concert in Veteran's Park and it was very difficult to hear because of passing trains. Please don't add a pavilion to this space. There are already: church, and Doubet-Benjamin Park. Thanks
- I did admire the flag display. I think it was Veteran's day or 4th of July.
- I dislike the addage of the caboose. Nothing to do with Veteran's, money could be spent on up keep. Get rid of the bandstand, no longer needed. The sad truth I seen more people use it as a pet restroom than anything.
- I do not actually visit the park but everyday when I go to the Post Office, I look at the Park and take in the beauty of it. In the past months, I have noticed people from out of town taking pictures of it. We are very fortunate to have this lite beauty where it is.

- I feel that I went there a lot while I was little. I moved away and now that I am back, I do not utilize it as I used. I need to get back in the habit of using it.
- I feel that the bandstand is a vital piece of the park. I worked to get the HS concert held a few years ago and it was incredible to see people congregated in one area of historic significs for an area wide event. It should be an annual event a long with thing like farmers markets. It would be a huge draw.
- I have tons of respect for the Veterans and people serving in the military and they deserve more than a little park. Think the Village needs to spend less on a new cop car when the police don't do anything but sit in it at the police station or around town. Salt for the roads or a bigger Veteran's Park would do more for the people then they do.
- I like the idea of benches at the park(or out at Doubet-Benjamin Park). You could offer to let people pay for a bench but the Village pays for the cement slab & installs the bench. People might purchase benches in honor or memory of others. JH Best in Galva has a template bench. I know it is expensive but a stage or bandstand would be awesome for concerts or gatherings.
- I think events involving the caboose should be planned otherwise it's "just a yard ornament." I think more music events and such should take place. Perhaps if the bandstand were in better repair, there might be more interest in these things.
- I think making it more kid and event friendly would be fantastic!
- I think that the caboose has been a great addition to the park that has really increased the number of people that go there.
- I think Veteran's Park is an asset to Williamsfield. I like the monuments and the caboose. I think a lot of people go to see the caboose and take pictures. Both the Veterans and RR are an interest to many and I would like to see more about RR in Williamsfield.
- I want to see it kept up and used more.
- I will attend fundraisers for park improvements.
- I would by very interested in a similar survey in regards to our police force and our roads. I know quite a few residents that feel the same. Thank you.
- I would like to see the original bandstand restored. It is a historical part of Williamsfield.
- If it were not for the railroad, there would be no park. I think the caboose adds to the park.
- Install dog run area-fenced with seating

- It's nice we have the park for our Veterans. I like that they put the flags up, very nice.
- It's Veteran's Park not railroad park. Caboose does not belong in the park.
- It's Veteran's Park. No need for bandstand, caboose(waste of tax payers money) caboose money could have been used for updates on memorials, monuments etc. Caboose makes the area look cramped and trashy along side of broken down bandstand.
- Monuments should stay where they are. Bandstand should be fixed-sure plenty of money can be raised big part of history. Caboose?
- Monuments-do not remove, Bandstand-restore or replicate (exact copy) see Elmwood or Princeville Parks. Caboose-not sure how it fits into theme of Veteran's Memorial Park, likely with thorough planning would have made more sense to have voted placement in Doubet-Benjamin Park which offers vast square footage/varied themes.
- More familiar with Burlington Northern not Santa Fe
- Movie night for the kids or music for adults
- Nothing at park currently to bring anyone back to after seeing it once. Just needs maintained, kept clean.
- Park is to honor Veterans sacrifice. Anything else should be in Doubet-Benjamin Park
- Railroad history would be ideal. The town was built due to the railroad. The railroad & military are connected.
- Remove bandstand before it falls in. Replace with pavers large round area then branched off paths with more benches and floral, a few more trees. Peaceful place to walk and sit but also nice for Saturday markets/crafts/antiques. I think larger venues mentioned above would be better suited at Doubet-Benjamin Park.
- Save the bandstand.
- Save the bandstand. Caboose looks out of place should have sent "your opinion matters" survey sooner. Instead of hidden agenda by the same 4 to 5 people on all committees some with tasteless ideas that do not live in Williamsfield-61489
- Save the bandstand. It's history.
- Save the bandstand. Leave monuments in Veteran's Memorial Park. The bandstand has history and sets us aside from other small towns; please do not demolish.
- Separate maintenance man for the Parks.
- The addition of the caboose with the proximity of the dual err tracks is an opportunity to highlight our long err heritage. A bigger functional covered bandstand is long overdue.

- The bandstand is most important to the town for the older people in town. Do not remove bandstand.
- The bandstand needs to be tore down. It is dangerous. The bandstand and caboose can co-exist together. It is a nice addition to the park. Williamsfield has a lot of railroad history.
- The bandstand should be removed, allowing easier access to the picnic area and park setting. Make information signs along a walking path to the caboose to increase education interest and possibly visits to Williamsfield
- The bandstand was decent at one point, but it is dangerous in its current state. The caboose is an interesting attraction and looks nicely decorated.
- The caboose is why people are visiting the park now. I've personally heard complaints about the caboose which isn't hurting anything sitting where it is. I love the old bandstand but without raising money to fix it, it could hurt someone. The people throwing a fit should be willing to chip in to preserve it. I would help with a fundraiser.
- The caboose should not be in Veteran's Memorial Park. It should have been put in Doubet-Benjamin Park if anywhere.
- The monuments are a great tribute to the military families in town but they block the park and break up the useability of that space. They could be featured in a better location I think.
- The park can be used for community events that are different than the Doubet-Benjamin Park
- The park need to be accessible to all members of the community- not just a select few. Williamsfield has a rich history that should not be ignored because of 1 disgruntled community member.
- There is room in the park for both the caboose and monuments. It would be nice to safely be able to hold events in the park. The bandstand need to be replaced.
- This park serves a "special purpose" The caboose was a finishing touch. The monuments are special and I love the flag being there. It's perfectly located. When we are out and about, it is so nice to pause and reflect.
- Too much in the park at one time makes it look junky! Keep it simple.
- Truthfully, the monuments and anything military makes more sense to be relocated out in front of the American Legion. More visibility and more legion celebration there. Caboose needs to stay. Railroad history and themes might bring more visitors to downtown and more usage of the space. Downtown is undergoing improvements and revitalization- this should include the park.
- Veteran's Memorials only! Rail road related items should be displayed elsewhere. 3 other parks that can be used for railroad items.
- Why worry about the park when the road conditions are terrible throughout the entire town!!! Focus should be more towards the roads.
- Williamsfield was founded because of the railroad, I believe the military monuments and the caboose can fit very well in the park together.
- Would like to see more activities at the park. Siren should be moved out of the park.
- You may attract some rail fans from out of town if we do something with the caboose/rail history of Williamsfield
